



AVI50215 Diploma of Aviation (Commercial Pilot Licence – Aeroplane)

Overview

A specialist qualification for the aviation industry, this exciting course equips you with the skills you need to become employed with a charter or airline company. As well as becoming an expert in complex technical flight operations, you will learn to select appropriate equipment, participate as part of a team, solve problems and develop strategic initiatives. This qualification is delivered in partnership with Aero Dynamic Flight Academy (RTO 31217) and Flight One who specialise in the training and support of recreational, commercial and airline pilots for the domestic and international markets.

Study Pathways

Upon successful completion of the AVI50215 Diploma of Aviation (Commercial Pilots Licence - Aeroplane); learners may elect to undertake a complimentary qualification, skill set or other qualifications that may assist them with career aspirations with Australis College or another training provider. You'll Learn To

This qualification reflects the roles of flight crew personnel performing normal and emergency commercial pilot duties in support of commercial or defence aviation flight operations.

Flight crew duties include applying technical and non-technical aviation skills and knowledge to a wide range of air transport operations, including passenger, charter and cargo operations.

Individuals working at this level will apply knowledge and skills to demonstrate autonomy, judgement and defined responsibility in known or changing contexts and within broad but established parameters.

This qualification forms some of the requirements for certification as a commercial pilot by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) as directed by Civil Aviation Safety Regulation (CASR) Part 61 Flight crew licensing.

People seeking certification should check these requirements with CASA. Use for Defence Aviation is to be in accordance with relevant Defence Orders, Instructions, Publications and Regulations.

Entry Requirements

This qualification is for learners new to the aviation industry holding no pilot licences at enrolment.

Commercial or military pilot entrants to this qualification should check requirements with CASA or Defence Aviation for certification and/or flight hour requirements.

Prerequisites

Whilst there are no prerequisites according to the Training Packaging Rules, the Civil Aviation and Security Association (CASA) state that learners should be able to pass the aviation English proficiency at level 6, in addition they suggest they have a reasonable grasp of mathematics. Therefore there is no evidence required as part of the enrolment process, but these points are discussed with the potential student to ensure their awareness of these skills in order to achieve a CASA licence outcome in addition to completing the Diploma course.

In addition, pre-requisites to flying (to achieve the practical aspects of the course) learners require;

- Current Class 1 or 2 (as applicable to PPL/CPL) aviation medical
- ASIC Security Clearance*
- A good watch with a clear face and a sweeping second hand*
- Uniform** (which can be purchased when advised during the course).

An LLN Core Skills Pre-Assessment may be conducted by the Student Support Manager prior to course enrolment or a copy of results from a CSPA LLN test may be submitted to assess a pass rate of level 3 for reading and numeracy. This will allow Australis College to assess the level of support that a learner may require to be successful in their training program. Additionally, students are required by CASA to hold speaking level 6 and a reasonable grasp of maths to qualify for their CASA licences.

* Students are required to provide these at their own expense prior to course enrollment.

** These items will be purchased by the student at their own expense when advised by the trainer throughout the course.

Combine Theory with Practical Flight Time

This course comprises of a total of 29 units of competency comprising: 28 core units listed below plus one general elective unit from the general elective units listed below.

Training will be delivered primarily face-to-face with a self-study component, and examination for CASA requirements. Training and assessment delivery is Queensland only, based at:

- Archerfield Aerodrome
- Sunshine Coast Airport
- Hervey Bay Airport

The course is structured so that full-time students are to attend class approximately 38 hours per week in class and practical sessions with additional self-paced learning, web forums and research outside of class.

Included in the practical sessions:

- Use of aircraft
- Use of flight simulator

All training and assessment of this qualification will be conducted by authorised aviation partners of Australis Aviation College.

CASA examinations may also be used as evidence of competency. Assessment is conducted in accordance with the Vocational Education Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence.

For learners wanting to on to hold a Recreational, Private and/or Commercial Pilot Licence through CASA, they will be required to access the CASA examinations test system. The CASA exams will also be used during the diploma course to gather VET evidence of competency and will be fully mapped to show items crossed over. A passed exam result from CASA with knowledge deficiency areas will be subject to further summative testing to close out Knowledge Deficiency Report (KDR) areas, to confirm full competency. The cost of these exams will be covered through the course cost for the first attempt.

Note: Remedial flights are not covered under VET FEE-HELP (for any students still utilising this method of payment); students who require further training to be deemed competent under the CASA syllabus will be required to cover this at their own expense with the flight training provider.

Please be aware that while elements of training may be provide by authorised aviation partners, Australis College (RTO 31518) is responsible for the course and issue of all Statements of Attainment and Diploma Certificates.
